
Trends: Membership

Membership continues to decline

- Fully paid members down by 1% in 2024 to 23,214
- Fully paid members down by 11% over 10 yrs

Revenue per member is broadly flat

 Total revenue per member is £82. This up from £73 in 2014, slightly behind inflation





Trends: Operating Profit/Loss

Track record is not good


- Operating losses have been made in 7 of the last 10 years
- Cumulative losses over that period amount to £322k
- Losses in 2020 can be largely be attributed to covid
- Excludes grant income





Trends: Cash and Reserves

- Cash levels and reserves have been dropping
- Reserves are now at the lowest for over 10 years





Key Messages

2024 was a significant improvement on recent prior years, however:

- Membership continues to decline
- 2024 income from Egypt and Interest will decline in 2025
- Cash and reserves are close to 10 yr lows

We must deliver on the major initiatives already underway:

- Stopping the erosion of membership numbers through the 5yr strategy
- Obtaining the efficiency benefits from AMS
- Achieving a better financial return from our assets.

We must continue with improvements at all levels:

- Growing revenue where there are opportunities without unduly increasing risk
- Maintaining tight discipline over costs and cash flow
- Exploring changes to the business model


