Guest speaker abstracts and biographies

Your host for the day – Andy Torbet

Diver, adventurer, BBC presenter and more recently 007's underwater stunt double on the new Bond film, Andy Torbet, will be keeping the main stage programme running smoothly as well as delegates entertained.

Andy joined Aberdeen BSAC at aged 12 as a Snorkel Member, back when diving was forbidden until aged 14. His first dive was in the freezing, near-nil viz waters of North Scotland in a poorly fitting wetsuit and Fenzy ABLJ. The intervening 29 years of diving have seen him on many an adventure. From commanding the Army's Underwater Bomb Disposal Team and operating as part of the UK's Maritime Counter-Terrorist Unit, through to freediving under Alaskan ice and carrying out cave diving exploration projects, this diving action man has seemingly done it all. Andy has presented 22 TV series' on various channels and has written over 300 articles, mostly about technical and cave diving. However, his longest running series is his monthly column for BSAC's SCUBA Magazine on nothing more extreme than snorkelling! Which, incidentally, was meant to be a short nine-month run... 96 months later he's still going.



Dr Neal Pollock

Neal Pollock is an Associate Professor in Kinesiology at Université Laval in Québec. He is also the Research Chair in Hyperbaric and Diving Medicine and conducts research at the Centre de Médicine de Plongée du Québec. Neal is academically trained in

zoology, exercise physiology and environmental physiology. His primary interests focus on human health and safety in extreme environments. He currently serves on the executive board of the Canadian Undersea and Hyperbaric Medical Association (CUHMA), as Scientific Director of Undersea Medicine Canada, and on the diving control board of the University of the Virgin Islands. He is also serves as Editor-in-Chief of the journal Wilderness & Environmental Medicine and on the editorial board of the journal Diving and Hyperbaric Medicine. He lectures extensively, both locally and internationally.

In his talk - The Future of Diver Protection - Neal will consider the changing nature of equipment dependency in our sport and juxtapose human physiology alongside recent, emerging and future technologies to demonstrate how both risks and protections are evolving and are likely to continue evolving.

Head of Anaesthesiology at the University of Auckland, Simon's published. A lifelong passionate diver Simon has been a leading contributor

to the development of diving medicine and diver safety for most of his academic life, with more than 150 research papers and book chapters in the medical literature domain. Simon has received the Undersea and Hyperbaric Medical Society's highest award for scientific contributions to the field, and awarded Rolex Diver of the Year by DAN in 2015. He's currently the editor of the highly-acclaimed quarterly scientific journal, Diving and Hyperbaric Medicine. A much-sought after speaker internationally Simon will treat BSAC delegates to the valuable insights of a topic close to his heart.

In his talk - The shortest road to increased safety in diving - Simon will surprise those familiar with his talks and delight all, as he draws deep on his wealth of professional experience and knowledge to distil for us all, what every diver wants to know...how to deliver extraordinary gains in our own personal diving safety.






















Catherine Gemmell

In her talk - **Environmentally-responsible club diving** – Catherine will offer a practical guide for clubs to help them become even more environmentally responsible.



Commissioned Officer in the Royal Navy Jen Smith has been deployed on maritime operations around the world. More recently she has been the Royal Navy Liaison Officer to a number of licensed underwater surveys of Royal Navy wrecks. To preserve their heritage Jen works with a team of

volunteer civilian divers to record these poignant sites.

In her talk - **HMS Royal Oak, 80 years underwater** - Jen will be sharing new images and 3D Photogrammetry models of HMS Royal Oak, now lying at 33 metres in Scapa Flow.



James is a biologist by degree and a storyteller by heart. He was Executive Producer of the BBC hit series, "Blue Planet II". The so-called "Blue Planet Effect" became part of the national conversation, and created undeniable impact both in Britain and around the world. The series broke all records as the mostwatched wildlife documentary in a generation.



Emma, Alex and Sarah will be joining James as part of his new team producing a landmark natural history series for a streaming service. Between them they have over 50 years of diving experience in BSAC. The marine world is their passion.

In his talk – Ocean Exploration and Wildlife Filmmaking – James and his team will share their adventures, challenges and filmmaker's role in conservation.

Eugene Farrell

Qualified in radiotherapy, health economics and psychology Eugene has more than 30 years' experience in UK healthcare. For the past 20 years, he has specialised in the development and provision of mental health, counselling and wellbeing support services in the corporate environment. Former BSAC Chair and board member Eugene continues to volunteer as a coach and Instructor Trainer.


