In the case of specific areas that need improvement these should be identified and covered.</p>	
Owner Maintenance Workshop	04/06/23	<p>OK</p> <p>Insufficient evaluation, OK infers meets the required standard but does mean significant room for improvement. Any areas for development and how to do so should be detailed on a priority basis.</p>	
Dive Planning	04/06/23	<p>You struggled with this, ok by the end.</p> <p>The comment is hardly inspiring or motivating! It needs to be more positive and constructive. Similar to above, detail for development is needed.</p>

All very good by the end except for bail out.</p> <p>The issues around bail out should be explained and prioritised.likely buoyancy/trim/attachment/clip issues.</p> <p>The 'good resolutions' could usefully be covered to reinforce good behaviour/skills.</p>	<p>Bail out, or specific elements of bail out exercises need to be listed to be remedied on the next dive</p> <p>Time 60+40 minutes</p>

Open water dive 1	<p>All good</p> <p>Not in itself a poor comment, it does however mean development toward excellent is possible and whilst there may be no 'skills to carry forward' developmental advice should be given identifying and prioritising specific areas.</p> <p>Reference to the bail out issues on the previous dives should be made</p>	<p>Diluent flushes</p> <p>Inappropriate comment, it conflicts directly with the instructor comments opposite, one or perhaps both needs amending!</p> <p>Dive Time 50 +20 minutes</p>
Open water dive 2	<p>We completed all the exercises although buoyancy and trim need further work as you kept floating up.</p> <p>Further analysis of the issues around buoyancy and trim need review. This at the least should have been done verbally, else it will recur in the next session. A written record would be valuable in addressing similar issues at a future date</p>	<p>None</p> <p>This means buoyancy and trim were acceptable which conflicts directly with the instructor comments opposite, again one or perhaps both needs amending!</p> <p>Dive Time 45min</p>

Open water dive 3	<p>Buoyancy and trim still need some work, you kept floating up, it hasn't really improved. You believe switching to your thick under-suit could have made a difference.</p> <p>IF the buoyancy /trim issue had been addressed better after Dive 2, it should have avoided it causing further problems. Re-weighting with additional weight and addressing it's positioning for trim should have been carried out.</p> <p>There is no comment in relation to assessment of the skills listed for this dive. Comments should be balanced; therefore, consideration of competence and confidence of the set skills should be included not ignored.</p>	Dive Time 70 min
Open water dive 4	<p>Still no good at High PO2(warning) >1.6bar drill or the High PO2 (no warning) <1.6bar PO2. You keep rushing a response and turning off the diluent cylinder</p> <p>Such comments need to explain how to succeed e.g. slow down, consider the issue, the problem is on the oxygen side, is it safe to continue to breathe the breathing gas if not bail out to a known gas supply etc.</p>	Dive Time 12 and 61min
Open water dive 5	<p>You mastered your poor skills with high PO2 drills</p> <p>If the above is the only comment it does not consider progress in managing all other skills and the reduction of usage of prompt cards to finally only indicate issue/symptoms</p> <p>Given their problems it is worth reinforcing what they did well in order to succeed.</p>	Dive Time 65 minutes
Open water dive 6	<p>You proved an able buddy and now appear comfortable and confident at all skills</p> <p>Great that they've proven their CCR skills, yet no mention of Dive Leading a form of task loading and necessary on their future dives. By omitting it from this lesson (and no mention of it in the previous lesson), if it is an air dil. course has this skill been covered as required by the syllabus. If a trimix dil. course it only allows one dive to practice their Dive leading and no opportunity to implement any</p>	Dive Time 62 minutes

Open water dive 7	<p>You proved an able buddy with good all round CCR skills.</p> <p>Expect to be contacted by the Chief Examiner.</p> <p>Whilst it's great the student is good with all CCR skills the syllabus for this and the previous lessons detail Dive Leading by the student as a requirement. Whilst some flexibility/adaptability in approach is accepted as necessary at times, the syllabus must be met. We need to be satisfied in not only their CCR skills but concurrently their ability to manage the extra task loading of Dive leading.</p>	<p>Dive Time 63 min.</p> <p>Total Time Underwater 548 min.</p>
